Notes from the Annual General Meeting 12th October 2012

48 Members were present at the meeting and 28 sent apologies.

Alan Leadbetter has been unanimously elected as President Elect for the following year.

The new programme contains a number of easier and shorter walks which is probably wise if the uncertain (or certainly wet) weather continues. There are compensations, for example, the first ended at the Homestart Soup fund raiser!. – DO JOIN US in the following walks

10.30 am Wed, 30:01:13 Fisherman's and Hunter's Path, Fingle Bridge: 5 miles
Led by John B

Meet 10.30 in the car parking area on the road to Fingle Bridge Inn.

I suggest the walk from Fingle Bridge upstream on the Fisherman's path and back either via the Hunters path or on the other side of the river depending on conditions. Lunch at the pub. About 2 hours.

10.30 Th 14:02:13 Tom's Valentine's Day stroll: 7 miles
Led by Tom **PACKED LUNCH REQUIRED**

Start at Brampford Speke, near the Lazy Toad/church. Down Sandy Lane to Starved Oak Cross, then Great Oak Cross and eventually Berrybridge and Thorverton. Back to BS via Yellowford and Willowpark then Fortesque. If it is dry enough the return from Thorverton could be through fields via Netherexe Barton. About 7 miles.

10.30 Tue 26:02:13 Shobrooke: 6 - 7 miles.
Led by Roger **PACKED LUNCH ADVISED / Possible late pub lunch**

Start at Shobrooke (OS Landranger 192 or Explorer 114, GR872014) and proceed to Stockleigh Pomeroy - Chilton -Cherlton Cross - Westwood Farm - Shobrooke, 6-7 miles, with a voluntary extra loop (1 mile+) south of Shobrooke for those who would like a slightly longer walk. Be prepared for wet and muddy conditions. Some space for parking in the road at the start of the walk, otherwise 200 yards further up the village. I don't think the occasional bus service is an option but if anyone is stuck for transport, if they can get themselves to Thorverton by 10.00 we could offer a lift. Anyone wanting this option should email me.

10.30 Tue, 12:03:13 Two Moors Way circular walk: 7 - 8 miles
Led by Tom **PACKED LUNCH REQUIRED**

Start at Bennett's Cross (OL28, GR 681817) and walk clockwise to West Coombe, then Moor Gate, Lepra Cross, Lettaford, Jurston, Lingcombe, Hurston then back to Bennett's Cross. About 7 or 8 miles with no steep ascents. If it stops raining soon it should be ok by March.

10.30 Th 28:03:13 Steps Bridge (Daffodils?): 4 – 5 miles
Led by Jarka

Meet at the car park at Steps Bridge. This is a mainly flat 4 – 5 mile circular walk along the Teign to Clifford Bridge and back via Cod Wood. Lunch is possible at Steps Bridge or Longdown.
